Dear Senator:

America's hospitals strongly oppose a proposal to cut funding for seniors' Medicare to pay for the repeal of the reduction in the cost-of living adjustment for military retirees. While we do not oppose the repeal of the reduction in the cost-of living adjustment for military retirees, we *do* oppose using Medicare reductions to pay for non-Medicare related spending.

Medicare has been cut time and time again – most recently under the budget agreement signed into law in December. Medicare is meant to assure seniors access to needed medical care, not serve as a piggybank for other programs. It is bad policy to further extend Medicare sequester cuts that could undermine care for seniors.

Hospitals already face \$113 billion in cuts that have been imposed over the last three years at a time of enormous change and challenges. We urge you to reject this proposal, which will jeopardize health services for seniors.
