Nelly also represents the AHA as one of the ICD-9-CM Cooperating Parties responsible for the development of the ICD-9-CM Official Guidelines for Coding and Reporting, and has chaired the AHA's Rehabilitation Coding Workgroup.

Terrie Black, MBA, BSN, RN, BC, CRRN, is the Chief Clinical Officer at the Uniform Data System for Medical Rehabilitation in Buffalo, NY. In this role, she oversees Education & Training. In addition, her department staff the CMS Help Desk, the official source of information for the IRF PAI. Terrie is a past President of the Association of Rehabilitation Nurses (ARN) and a past member of the Editorial Board for SCI Nursing. She has published articles in peer reviewed journals and was a chapter author for the rehabilitation nursing Core Curriculum (4th ed.). She has presented at numerous local, national and international rehabilitation conferences and serves on the Rehabilitation Coding Workgroup.
