

Henry Chung, M.D. is currently Vice President and Chief Medical Officer of Care Management Company of Montefiore Medical Center. He is also Associate Professor of Clinical Psychiatry at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine. At CMO, he provides medical leadership for care management and disease management activities for over 140,000 patients at full financial risk and is CMO's principal medical liaison to Montefiore Medical Center's inpatient, outpatient and IPA programs. He is also Medical Director of the Montefiore Accountable Care Organization (ACO), an awardee of the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Innovations Pioneer ACO Program.

Dr. Chung has a track record of leadership and achievement in medical management and re-engineering of ambulatory care processes in both primary care and behavioral health settings. He has conducted research and published articles related to the integration of mental health treatment in primary care, particularly for racial and ethnic minorities. He has been widely recognized for this work with grant funding from Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, HRSA, SAMHSA, the Aetna Foundation, the American Psychiatric Institute for Research and Education, and many others for research and national implementation activities for the collaborative care of depression.

In 2006, he founded the award-winning National College Depression Partnership – Collaborative Action Network Project (www.nyu.edu/ncdp). The program (involving 30 colleges and universities since inception) was one of only 2 national winners of the 2009 Innovations in Quality Improvement Award given by the Accreditation Association of Ambulatory Health Care (AAAHC). Currently he is implementing a collaborative care pilot in the Montefiore ambulatory care system to improve depression and at risk drinking care among patients with chronic medical illness with funding by the New York Community Trust and the United Hospital Fund. In 2011, he was appointed to the Steering Committee of the HRSA-SAMHSA Center for Integrated Health Solutions. He also remains Co-Principal Investigator of the National Depression Leadership Initiative which is a joint collaboration of the American Psychiatric Association, American Academy of Family Physicians and the American College of Physicians.
