Dan Coffey serves as president and chief executive officer at Acadia Hospital and concurrently as senior vice president for Eastern Maine Healthcare Systems (EMHS). Located in Bangor, Maine, Acadia Hospital is a 100 bed psychiatric hospital providing specialized services to a large region of Maine. Services include acute inpatient and outpatient care for children, adolescents, and adults as well as a psychiatric observation unit.

Prior to being named CEO at Acadia Hospital three years ago, Dan served as EMHS executive vice president, treasurer, and chief financial officer. He has been employed at EMHS for 37 years involved with growth of an integrated health care delivery system that includes eight hospitals, a long term care joint venture, home health care services, and a dozen other joint ventures and support organizations stretching across the state.
