



Joseph M. Schulman, Executive Director, North Shore-LIJ Care Solutions

As executive director of North Shore-LIJ Care Solutions, Mr. Schulman oversees North Shore-LIJ's care management strategy and is responsible for the internal capabilities of its care management program in which mental health integration is a strategic imperative.

Mr. Schulman previously served as executive director of The Zucker Hillside Hospital, North Shore-LIJ's nationally recognized behavioral health center and was a member of the executive team leading behavioral health integration throughout the health system. Mr. Schulman also was the executive administrator of North Shore-LIJ's Office of Military and Veterans Liaison Services, which initiated a wide range of innovative and meaningful services for military personnel including active duty, veterans and their families throughout the region.

Mr. Schulman has worked for North Shore-LIJ since 2002 when he joined the organization as corporate director of internal audit services. In 2005, he was appointed chief financial officer of The Zucker Hillside Hospital and served as deputy executive director prior to his appointment as the hospital's executive director in 2009.

Before joining North Shore-LIJ, Mr. Schulman served as an operations consultant and manager for the former Mount Sinai-NYU Health System's corporate Audit Services Department, and managed logistics business operations for pediatrics and obstetrics at NYU Medical Center. In addition, Mr. Schulman supervised healthcare client engagements for Arthur Andersen's risk consulting practice.

Mr. Schulman is currently a member of the AHA Psychiatric and Substance Abuse Services Governing Council and he previously has served as a member of the executive committee of the National Association of Psychiatric Health Systems board of trustees having previously held the positions of board secretary and treasurer.
