Our session will focus on Denver Health's nationally recognized hospital sponsored school based health center program helping Denver's students for over 25 years.

Denver Health has been a leader in the field of school based health centers (SBHC's) since 1988 when Abraham Lincoln High School first opened its doors to the first Denver SBHC. Last week for National Child Mental Health Awareness Day, SAMSHA acknowledged Abraham Lincoln SBHC mental health team as one of six programs featured nationally, who provides excellence in integrated health and behavioral health care for at-risk underserved students. Denver has 16 SBHC's and will be opening their 17th SBHC in the fall at a clinic designed to treat pregnant and parenting teens in Denver.

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Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist
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Specifically, this webinar will focus on the SBHC successes and challenges and lessons learned from providing integrated mental health treatment in schools from 1988-2015. You will hear:

- The demographics of children and teens served and strategies for engagement of this underserved population.
- How community mental health partnerships and district resources were leveraged to promote maximum support for students in need of mental health treatment who are unable to access local community mental health centers.
- From the program's full time psychiatrist who will overview case examples of students treated and the challenges of medication management in a school setting.
