

Robin Henderson, PsyD, is the Chief Executive, Behavioral Health for Providence Medical Group in Oregon. In this role, she is creating a consistent model of care for people in need of behavioral health services across the entire health system, with special focus on the three primary doors for care— primary care, the emergency department and the general hospital. She works closely with the health plan to align benefits to support population healthcare needs, and is focusing efforts on aligning Providence’s vast resources to integrate behavioral health throughout the communities they serve. Prior to this she spent 14 years at St Charles Health System, most recently as their Chief Behavioral Health Officer and Vice President of Strategic Integration. There she was responsible for the strategic direction, operations, and integration of behavioral health services across the health system and throughout primary care, and lead the health system's strategic plan and system portfolio. She also managed the health system's advocacy efforts and relations with government programs and community partners, including serving for three years as the executive director of the Central Oregon Health Council, the governance entity of the region’s Coordinated Care Organization.

Previously, Dr. Henderson served as Director of Behavioral Health at St. Charles, building the region’s first acute psychiatric services east of the Cascades. Prior to that, she was the Director of Behavioral Health Services at Eastmoreland and Woodland Park Hospitals and practiced as a psychologist working primarily with Native American children and families. Dr. Henderson served on the Person Centered Primary Care Home Standards Advisory Committee and the subsequent SB 231 workgroup, and was appointed to the Governor's Task Force on Primary and Mental Health Care Reimbursement, among many other state appointments. She is a past chair of the American Hospital Association's Governing Council for Psychiatry and Substance Abuse and currently serves as a member of the board of the National Alliance of the Mentally Ill of Oregon and CCO Oregon, where she served as chair in 2015. Dr. Henderson is a past chair of the Oregon Psychiatric Inpatient Committee of the OAHHS, past conference chair of the Collaborative Family Healthcare Association, and has served on the Oregon State Hospital Advisory Board. Dr. Henderson is an American Hospital Association Transformation Fellow, and a member of the 2015 class of the Leadership Institute for Women in Psychology. She received her doctorate in psychology from George Fox University, and completed post-doctoral training in integrated health psychology at Farleigh-Dickinson University. She is a past president of the Oregon Psychological Association, and currently serves as their Legislative Chair.
