

Timothy S. Coyne is the Public Defender for the City of Winchester and Counties of Clarke, Frederick, Page, Shenandoah and Warren. He received his undergraduate degree from the University of Virginia, and graduated from the T.C. Williams School of Law at the University of Richmond in 1986. Following graduation from law school, Tim worked as the *pro se* law clerk for the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia in Alexandria handling civil rights actions and habeas corpus petitions filed by prisoners. He then worked as a litigation attorney for the Federal Trade Commission in Washington, D.C. prosecuting civil investment fraud cases. In 1991, Tim and his wife moved to Winchester, Virginia to start their own private law practice. Tim also worked as a part-time Assistant Public Defender in Front Royal and Winchester until 1995, and continued to take state and federal court-appointed cases after leaving the Public Defender's Office. In 2004, Tim was appointed as the Public Defender for the Winchester office. Tim also served on the Winchester City Council from 2000 through 2008, and has been actively involved in many community boards and organizations. He is currently Vice-Chairman of the Northern Shenandoah Valley Substance Abuse Coalition, a diverse, community-based organization looking for ways to address the opioid epidemic plaguing the Northern Shenandoah Valley.
