

Dr. Hannah Snyder practices primary care and addiction medicine at Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital. She is a Clinical Assistant Professor in the Department of Family and Community Medicine at the University of California San Francisco. She completed Medical School at the University of Chicago, residency in Family and Community Medicine at the University of California San Francisco (UCSF), and a fellowship in Primary Care Addiction Medicine at UCSF. Her clinical work includes addiction consultation in clinic and in the hospital, primary care, and hospital medicine. She is a consultant for the UCSF Clinician Consultation Center Substance Use Warmline.

Dr. Snyder's work is focused on reducing barriers for patients seeking medications to treat substance use disorders. She is the Director of Project SHOUT (Support for Hospital Opioid Use Treatment, [www.projectshout.org](http://www.projectshout.org)). She speaks to national audiences on the subject of opioid use disorder treatment in the inpatient setting and coaches hospitals on building this capacity. Over 300 providers and sites have taken advantage of SHOUT materials to help improve care in their hospital.
