HELPING MUSLIMS GET VACCINATED DURING RAMADAN



Vaccines do not invalidate a fast



Remind people that vaccine formulas don't contain food substances or vitamin issues



Amplify trusted voices of Imams



Consider early morning or late night vaccine appointments

WEEKS BEFORE YOU VACCINATE



Give people a chance to ask questions related to vaccines (town hall, hotline, etc.)



Vaccinate Imams and vaccine-site volunteers



Talk about vaccination at Friday prayers and other events

KEYS TO SUCCESSFUL VACCINE OUTREACH



Convenient, trusted location



Volunteers people know



Continued appointments to meet demand



Comfort: no lines, water available, chairs 6 ft apart
