

Maternal Mortality in the U.S. Far Outstrips That of Other Industrialized Nations




Data...creates a call to action

📕 Neonatal 📃 Postneonatal





Has seen a 65% decline in maternal mortality between 2006 and 2016






How to Measure - Kirkpatrick



Two types of measures used in health care

1 Outcome Measures

2 Process Measures





Outcome measures are "high-level clinical or financial outcomes".



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Some examples of metrics for outcome measures include mortality rates, readmissions rates, and surgical site infection rates

Process measures are "the

specific steps in a process that lead - either positively or negatively - to a particular outcome metric."



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Examining the ED LOS metric, you might determine that a lengthy delay in radiology reads impacts the speed of diagnosis and discharge.

This process measure helped identify a concrete **opportunity** for improvement









No Need to Reinvent the Wheel!!

- 1. What is it you are already measuring?
 - Decision to incision?
 - Infection rates?
 - Provider notification times?
- 2. Add a TeamSTEPPS tool
 - Huddle
 - SBAR
- 3. Measure the "before and after" picture
 - Process measure
 - Outcome measure

Show me the Evidence! Quantitative (numbers)



Quantitative Examples

* Statistics on health outcomes, incidence, mortality, morbidity

* Dashboards, survey results, research data

* Reputation: hospital ranking

* Financial impact: health care costs, lost revenue



Show me the Evidence! Qualitative (narrative)



Qualitative Examples

- * Example case studies and stories
- * Testimonials (written, video)
 Patients and families (social, emotional)
 Peers (wellness, burnout)

* Themes analyzed from survey comments




