




Role of TeamSTEPPS Master Trainers

Considerations When Selecting Master Trainers

- 1. Formal and informal leaders
- 2. Interprofessional (not just RNs and MDs)
- 3. Will serve in one or more of the Master Trainer roles






Our Curriculum Supports Interprofessional Teams: Human-Centered Design Thinking









Our Curriculum Supports Interprofessional Teams: Psychological Safety

- Trust and empowerment are requisite for healthy interprofessional teams.
- Psychological safety is foundational to trust, empowerment and mutual support.
- Psychological safety will levelset speak up culture in briefs, huddles and debriefs





Our Curriculum Supports Interprofessional Teams: By Creating a Map for Consistency and High Reliability

- TeamSTEPPS tools:
 - Structure reproducibility through predictable processes
 - Decrease the noise through shared language
 - Drive out variation through tools based on best practice
