## **BUILDING A COMMUNITY-BASED CARE COORDINATION EFFORT**

Freeman Health System in southwest Missouri recognized that many medically complex patients visiting its emergency departments would be better served if connected with primary care providers and relevant community resources.




Freeman Health System's collaborative efforts to learn about these patients' social needs sparked creation of a network dedicated to changing the way referrals are made.



Over three years, a partnership that began between Freeman Health System and 10 social service organizations in Joplin, Mo., has grown into the 90-member strong Care Partner Network. This network includes:

- More than a third of participants from neighboring counties

Network partners are committed to working together to better address social drivers of health and provide better care to patients.


