Pathways to Becoming an Age-Friendly Health System

WHAT? Age-Friendly Health Systems is a movement to ensure older adults receive safe, evidence-based care focused on what matters to them.

WHY? Age-friendly care is an urgent need. More than 54 million Americans are age 65 or over, and that number is projected to climb to about 95 million by 2060. Many older adults have complex care needs. They may have more than one chronic disease and take multiple medications.

WHO? Nearly 5,000 care settings, including hospitals and health systems, ambulatory care and skilled nursing facilities, have been recognized as "age friendly."

HOW? Individuals and clinical teams can follow one or more pathways to learn more about the movement and help their organization become an Age-Friendly Health System. Whichever pathway is selected, participation is free, with support from the John A. Hartford Foundation.
