## AHA APPOINTS NEW TRUSTEE TO ITS BOARD

**WASHINGTON** (March 18, 2014) – Kimberly McNally, MN, RN, a trustee at UW Medicine in Seattle, today was named to the Board of Trustees of the American Hospital Association (AHA). As past trustee and board president of the Harborview Medical Center/UW Medicine, McNally served on the executive, governance and quality committees. Active in AHA, she served on the Committee on Governance and also served as chair. She also served on the AHAPAC Steering Committee and is a current member of the Center for Healthcare Governance National Board of Advisors.

"I'm honored to join the AHA Board at such an important time of challenge and change in health care," McNally said. "Providing the best care possible and promoting wellness and prevention are top priorities for hospitals, patients and communities, and I'm looking forward to addressing these issues on behalf of hospitals across the nation."

McNally served on the Washington State Hospital Association board and is past chair of the governing board committee. She also serves on the Seattle Cancer Care Alliance board and she served on the boards of Seattle Mental Health and Washington Homecare Association.

She received a bachelor of science degree in nursing from Saint Anselm College in Manchester, N.H. and a master's degree in nursing from the University of Washington.
